Welcome to West Texas and Big Bend National Park. From the town of Marfa to the rugged and rocky canyons of the Rio Grande to the Chisos Mountains, we will explore this diverse landscape and take a dive deep into the region's cultural history. Big Bend is one of the nation's least visited national parks and has been designated a Dark Sky Park. It is also deeply vulnerable to the effects of climate change and air pollution. Your guide and accompanying NPCA host will show you a lesser-known side of the park as we explore by foot and on water, often with key local partners by our side. We'll also explore the complex legacy of racial tension and social justice movements in the borderland's region, including debates over immigration and the border wall. Leave with a deeper understanding of this landscape, its cultural history and the ongoing challenges that make Big Bend an important priority for NPCA. Experience one of the wildest corners of America—and its unforgettable sights and solitude—with all the comfort of an NPCA small-group tour.

ITINERARY

DAY El Paso to Marfa

1 Arrive mid-afternoon at El Paso International Airport (ELP), the gateway to West Texas. On arrival, meet your trip leader and NPCA host. Transfer in private shuttle to the town of **Marfa, Texas**, approximately a three-hour drive. Settle into your room at our historic downtown hotel before we gather as a group for brief introductions and an orientation to the days ahead. In the evening, enjoy a group **welcome reception and dinner** at a local restaurant. *The Hotel Paisano, Marfa (D)*

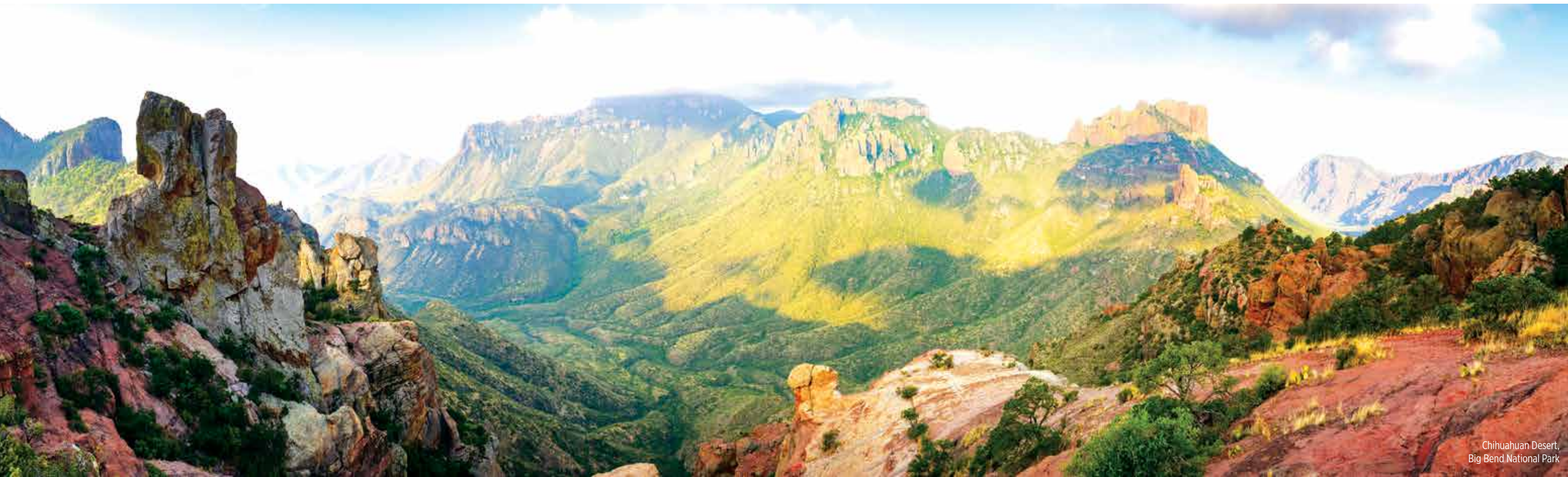
DAY The Blackwell School to Big Bend National Park

2 This morning we will meet with NPCA partners at **The Blackwell School Alliance** for a private tour of **The Blackwell School**, a historic three-room schoolhouse in **Marfa** that tells the story of segregated education in the state. On our tour, we will learn how NPCA is working hand-in-hand with the alliance to preserve the original schoolhouse and grounds and establish a new park site, the **Blackwell School National Historic Site**. This partnership represents an authentic opportunity to preserve and share the complicated history and significant role of the Latinx community in our nation's history. After a lunch with our partners from The Blackwell School Alliance, we'll head south through **Persimmon Gap** into the beautiful **Big Bend National Park** to **Chisos Mountain Lodge**, the only lodge located within the park and our home for the next four nights (a two-and-a-half-hour drive). This evening, enjoy dinner as a group at the lodge. *Chisos Mountain Lodge (B, L, D)*

HIGHLIGHTS

- Gaze at the brightest stars at this International Dark Sky Park during a night sky program

DAY 3 Paddling the Rio Grande

After an early breakfast, we'll start today's adventure on the **Rio Grande**, an approximately 1.5-hour drive from the lodge. Water conditions permitting, we'll gear up for a full day out on the water as we jump into our canoes and paddle* through **Santa Elena Canyon**, with its striking 1,500-foot sheer canyon walls rising up from the water's edge. Our float through this natural wonder is a once-in-a-lifetime experience. Enjoy lunch on a sandy riverbank while admiring the jaw-dropping views of this North American river that creates the divide between the United States and Mexico. On this evening, relax at the lodge before eating dinner as a group. Tonight, you have the option to head outside for a magnificent **dark sky program**. **Chisos Mountain Lodge (B, L, D)**

DAY 4 Big Bend National Park

After breakfast at your leisure in the lodge, meet the group and head out for the day. During our first stop at the **Big Bend landfill**, we will have the opportunity to learn how NPCA is partnering with the park to significantly reduce waste and improve waste management throughout the park. Big Bend is the only national park with a landfill within its boundaries. After a brief tour, we continue to head south on a 45-minute scenic drive through the park to the **Boquillas border crossing**. Explore **Boquillas Canyon** and enjoy a picnic lunch before we sit down with our local NPCA experts to learn about the economic, environmental and humanitarian aspects of this border region. From here, we'll head 15 minutes down the road to the **Boquillas Hot Springs** where we can soak our tired muscles before heading back to Chisos Mountain Lodge for dinner. **Chisos Mountain Lodge (B, L, D)**

DAY 5 Big Bend Hiking and the Town of Terlingua

After breakfast at the lodge, join the group for a five-minute shuttle ride to the **Lost Mine Trailhead**. This morning, we will hike alongside our NPCA host on this beautiful, moderately difficult 4.2-mile out-and-back trail through the Chisos Mountains. After enjoying stunning views of Casa Grande and Juniper Canyon, we'll climb up through juniper, oak and pine forest to rewarding views of Pine Canyon and the Sierra del Carmen in Mexico. Enjoy a picnic lunch as you take in this spectacular landscape. This afternoon, relax with some down time at the lodge or head out on another short hike before we drive the 45 minutes into **Terlingua**. A ghost town today, Terlingua was a mining town around the turn of the century. The views from this small town are some of the best in Big Bend—on a clear day you can see over 80 miles



More than 450 species of birds and 1,200 plant species can be found in Big Bend. When you're on the trails, keep an eye out for this remarkable diversity of life.

to the Santa Fe de Los Pinos mountain range in Mexico. On this evening, explore Terlingua on your own before dinner and live music at an important local landmark, the **Starlight Theatre**. for dinner. **Chisos Mountain Lodge (B, L, D)**

DAY 6 Big Bend to Fort Davis

6 This morning, enjoy your last breakfast at Chisos Mountain Lodge and an optional morning nature walk with our NPCA host before we load up and begin our two-and-a-half-hour scenic drive to Fort Davis. On arrival, enjoy lunch and settle into our historic inn. This afternoon, we will explore **Fort Davis National Historic Site**, one of the best surviving examples of an Indian Wars frontier military post in the Southwest. On this evening, visit the **McDonald Observatory** for a dark sky program with NPCA and observatory staff. **Hotel Limpia (B, L, D)**

DAY 7 Fort Davis to El Paso and Home

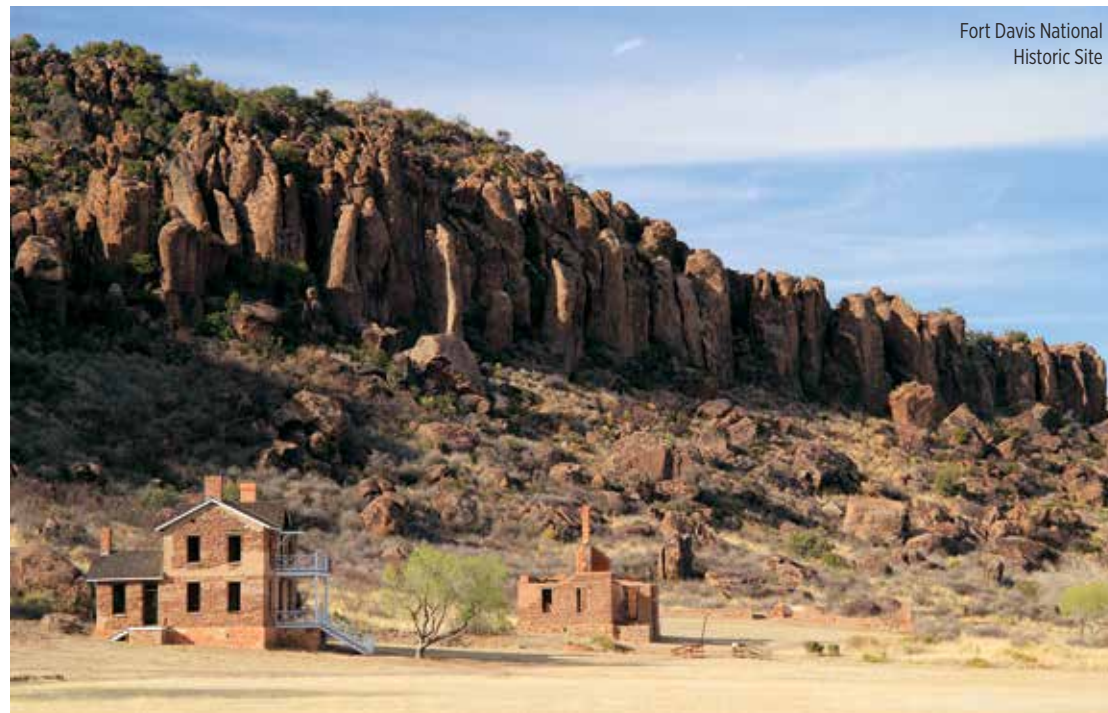
7 After breakfast, take the scenic drive to El Paso for departures home. **(B)**

Travel Insurance: To protect yourself from the loss of deposit and cancellation fees, you are encouraged to purchase travel insurance. If you need assistance, NPCA recommends contacting Travel Insurance Services; confirmation packets will include details.

The Hotel Paisano: The Hotel Paisano is a historic hotel featuring charming rooms, each of which is distinct. The hotel is one of five of the Gateway hotels designed by famed architect Henry Trost in 1929 and is situated in downtown Marfa, Texas.



Chisos Mountain Lodge: Located in the heart of Big Bend National Park, Chisos Mountain Lodge is the only lodge in the park and is nestled in the basin of the Chisos Mountains. Accommodations are rustic, providing basic comforts surrounded by stunning scenery.



The Hotel Limpia, Fort Davis: A historic hotel built in 1912, Hotel Limpia is located in mile-high Fort Davis, situated in the scenic Davis Mountains of southwest Texas. Accommodations are fully restored with private baths and period furnishings. The hotel setting provides a peaceful and comfortable hideaway from the busy outside world.
