Ship: *National Geographic Venture* (100 guests in 50 spacious outside cabins)

Inclusions: Four nights' accommodations aboard ship; all meals and nonalcoholic beverages aboard ship; shore excursions and sightseeing; use of kayaks and paddleboards; services of the Lindblad Expeditions' leader, naturalist staff and expert guides; all port charges and service taxes; and gratuities to local guides.

Exclusions: Airfare; airport transfers; REAL ID, passport and visa expenses if necessary; travel protection plan; optional diving; extensions; meals not indicated on itinerary; discretionary gratuities the ship's crew; items of a personal nature such as alcoholic beverages, voyage chronicle, laundry, etc.

Known by some as North America's Galápagos, the Channel Islands and their surrounding waters provide habitat for more than 2,000 species of plants and animals, including 150 species found nowhere else in the world. These islands are so significant that they were first protected as a national monument in 1938 and later became a national park in 1980.

Embark on an unprecedented five-day expedition into wildness and wellness in the remote and remarkable Channel Islands. Step aboard in Los Angeles and sail to three of the five wildlife-rich islands that make up Channel Islands National Park, plus Catalina Island. Dayboats can take you to a single island to hike or camp, but a true in-depth exploration of the Channel Islands on our nimble ship (with comfortable cabins) is a

unique offering and the only way to take in the full natural splendor of this extraordinary national park. It is akin to a safari camp in Africa—comfortable, in the heart of things, yet mobile. Everything you want is aboard—paddleboards, kayaks and Zodiacs; a welcoming crew; naturalists; a wellness specialist; and a certified photo instructor. You'll actively explore unmarred landscapes, revel in pure nature, and rejuvenate mind, body and soul.

Your NPCA staff host will provide in-depth information on NPCA's important role in the history of the park, including how NPCA helped to remove ranching and hunting operations on Santa Rosa Island, allowing native species to flourish and providing the public with unhindered access to this beautifully isolated place.

ITINERARY

DAY NOV 1: Los Angeles / Embark

1 Arrive in Los Angeles, or toss your bag in your car if you live there, and transfer to the Port of Los Angeles in the afternoon to be welcomed aboard. Familiarize yourself with the ship, stow your stuff and take in the sights on the ship's deck. We'll embark in the early evening—where you'll meet the team and settle in for the days ahead! *(D)*

DAY NOV 2: Anacapa and Santa Cruz Islands, Channel Islands National Park

2 Wake to the ship at anchor off the rocky outcropping of **East Anacapa Island**. Join your fitness instructor on the sundeck for morning yoga before heeding the call of the breakfast buffet. After breakfast, join naturalists aboard our Zodiacs (rigid inflatable boats) to go ashore on East Anacapa. The goal is the **Anacapa Island Lighthouse**, built in 1932, the last major light station to be built on the West Coast. Soak in the views from **Inspiration Point** or, for a more relaxing option, explore **Arch Rock** via Zodiac. *(B,L,D)*

DAY NOV 3: Santa Rosa Island, Channel Islands National Park

3 Kick-start your morning with a stretch class before breakfast. Weather permitting, go kayaking, hike one of the many trails or simply relax ashore. With luck, we may catch a glimpse—or photo—of the elusive **fox species endemic to the island**. Join the naturalists for a more strenuous hike out to the base of the **Torrey Pines State Natural Reserve**, which contains what is considered one of the world's rarest pines and is one of only two naturally occurring groves in the world. End the day with a sunset cocktail party. *(B,L,D)*

DAY NOV 4: Santa Catalina Island

4 Spend the day discovering the colorful history and natural wonders of **Catalina Island**. Once a haunt of smugglers and gold-diggers, the island was transformed into a resort destination by chewing gum tycoon William Wrigley, Jr. in the 1920s. Some 50 years later, William's heirs, Philip K. Wrigley and Dorothy Wrigley Offield, established the **Catalina Island Conservancy**, protecting nearly ninety percent of the island. After a morning workout on deck followed by breakfast, meet a conservancy member to learn about their work on the island before heading out on the trail for spectacular views of the coastline and the **Catalina backcountry**. With luck, catch a glimpse of the **elusive bison herd** that has resided on Catalina Island since 1924. Head for the water to kayak or stand-up paddleboard. After lunch, the ship arrives in **Avalon Harbor**, for a free-ranging afternoon on your own. Explore downtown Avalon, the island's only incorporated city, population a little under 5,000. Take the 30-minute (mostly uphill) stroll up **Avalon Canyon** to visit the **Wrigley Memorial and Botanical Gardens**. Or visit an architectural gem: the famous **Catalina Casino**, built by William Wrigley, Jr. in 1929.

Scuba-certified? Our team will arrange diving and gear rental for you with a top local operator. Return to the ship for a farewell dinner and a last evening at sea under the stars. *(B,L,D)*

DAY NOV 5: Los Angeles / Disembark

5 Awake dockside in the bustling **Port of Los Angeles** (early risers can catch the action in one of the world's largest ports). Enjoy a final breakfast on board before disembarking and either transferring to the airport or heading to your car or Uber—refreshed by your getaway. *(B)*

Travel Insurance: To protect yourself from the loss of deposit and cancellation fees, you are encouraged to purchase travel insurance. Activity Level: Our trips are appropriate for people in good health with overall good mobility. Travelers should be comfortable participating in up to three hours of physical activity per day, which include walking or standing for extended periods (sometimes on uneven terrain) and climbing stairs. Daily activities on this cruise are always offered in different levels - slow paced, moderate and faster paced hikes. Any physical conditions requiring special attention, diet, or treatment should be reported when booking to determine what accommodations can be made.

Traveler Responsibility: Travelers are responsible for choosing an NPCA trip consistent with their ability, fitness and overall health. All travelers are required to complete and return their NPCA waiver of liability, personal information form, flight form and accept Lindblad Expeditions' Terms and Conditions before being allowed to participate in a trip. Travelers also are responsible for reading and understanding all pre-departure materials and bringing appropriate clothing and gear.

Entry And Visa Requirements: Guests are advised to verify travel documents (REAL ID/passport/ transit visa/entry visa) for the country through which they are transiting and/or enter-

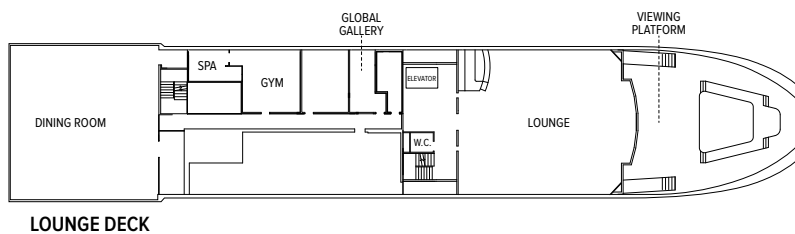
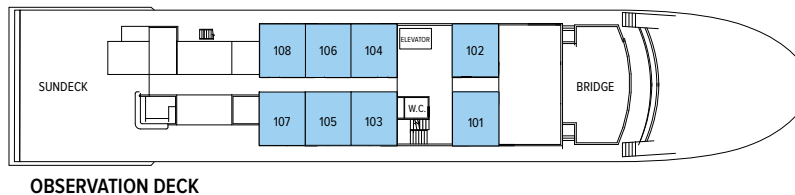
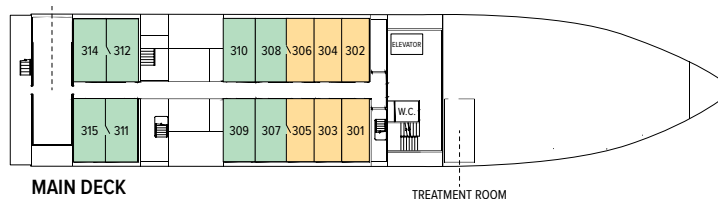

CATEGORY 1: Main Deck #301-306 Cabins feature two lower single beds that can convert to a Queen, a writing desk and two portholes.

CATEGORY 2: Main Deck #307-315 Cabins feature two lower single beds that can convert to a Queen, a writing desk and two portholes.

CATEGORY 3: Upper Deck #201-206 Cabins feature two lower single beds that can convert to a Queen, a writing desk and two large view windows.

CATEGORY 4: Upper Deck #207-229 Cabins feature two lower single beds that can convert to a Queen, a writing desk, large view window and small, private balcony.

CATEGORY 5: Observation Deck #101-108 Cabins feature two lower single beds that can convert to a Queen, large view windows, an expanded bathroom, writing desk, ample storage space and a convertible sofa bed to accommodate a third person.

NOTE: Sole Occupancy cabins are available in Categories 1 and 2 only. Third person rates are available in Category 5 cabins at one half the double occupancy rate.
