Activity Level: Travelers should be prepared for full-day adventures of walking, standing and sitting. This tour includes hikes and an opportunity to kayak. Hikes during our journey are typically 1-2 miles in length, with our longest being up to 5 miles. There is significant elevation descent and gain, and our hikes on Hurricane Ridge are at an elevation of around 5,000 feet. We recommend travelers bring hiking poles. All hikes are optional and, whenever possible, your guides will provide alternative options for either a shorter or less demanding route. Hikes, walks and vehicle transportation may be on rough terrain and take multiple hours. Any physical conditions requiring special attention, diet or treatment should be reported when booking to determine what accommodations can be made.

Inclusions: All outlined accommodations, meals as noted in the itinerary (B-breakfast, L-lunch, D-dinner) and non-alcoholic beverages (alcoholic beverages will be included for the welcome dinner and farewell dinner), standard gratuities and entry fees for activities listed in the itinerary.

Exclusions: Airfare to arrival location and from departure location, luggage charges, meals not included in the itinerary, alcoholic drinks (alcoholic beverages *will* be included for the welcome dinner and farewell dinner), travel insurance, items of a purely personal nature and any items not listed in Inclusions.

We'll visit pristine beaches, crystal-blue lakes and rainforests, leaving with a deeper understanding of this landscape and its ongoing challenges.



DAILY ITINERARY

DAY SEPTEMBER 17: Arrivals into Seattle and Transfer to Kalaloch Lodge

Arrive by 11:00 a.m. at Seattle-Tacoma International Airport (SEA), gateway to the Pacific Northwest. Upon arrival, we will meet with our NPCA group and take a private shuttle to **Kalaloch Lodge**, stopping for lunch and a short walk along the approximately 3-hour drive. Upon arrival, we'll settle into our rooms at our scenic coastal lodge before we gather as a group for introductions and a brief orientation to the days ahead. In the evening, we'll enjoy a welcome reception and dinner on-site at **Creekside Restaurant**. *Kalaloch Lodge* (*L*, *D*)

SEPTEMBER 18: Hoh Rain Forest and Ruby Beach


This morning, we will embark on a 1-hour drive to the **Hoh Rain Forest** – one of the most spectacular temperate rain forests in the world. Mosses and ferns blanket the ground, while lush canopies of trees shade you from above. It is truly one of the most incredible sights in **Olympic National Park** and is home to some of Earth's rarest nature sounds — sounds which can only be fully appreciated in the absence of man-made noise. We will spend the day hiking and exploring the Hoh Rain Forest with environmental scientist Lauren Kuehne, who has worked for several years studying the impact of military flights on the Olympic Peninsula soundscape. NPCA is advocating to protect the area's natural sounds from commercial air tours and Navy jet training flights, which disrupt precious ecosystems and the unique refuge of "the quietest place in America." During this exclusive excursion, hear from your NPCA host about the key campaign seeking to save this necessary space and why it is especially important for U.S. Veterans. After lunch in the park, we head back towards the coast, stopping at Ruby Beach. One of the crown jewels of Olympic National Park, it is famous for its reddish sand and large sea stacks. Take time to walk up and down the shoreline, basking in the incredible views, before returning to the lodge for dinner. Kalaloch Lodge(B, L, D)

DAY SEPTEMBER 19: Rialto Beach and Lake Crescent

After an early breakfast we'll take a scenic 1-hour drive from the lodge to the start of today's adventure at **Rialto Beach**. Weather conditions permitting, we'll look to arrive at the start of low tide. Joined by a **local naturalist**, spend the morning looking for colorful sea stars, rock crabs, wolf eels, pricklebacks, barnacles, clams and sea snails. We'll have time to hike to the unique **Hole-in-the-Wall** formation, all while watching for otters and seals in the distance. After lunch nearby, we'll drive 1 hour to beautiful **Lake Crescent Lodge**. Check into your comfortable and cozy accommodations before an optional hike to **Marymere Falls**. This evening, enjoy some downtime and relaxation at the lodge before dinner as a group. *Lake Crescent Lodge* (*B*, *L*, *D*)

DAY SEPTEMBER 20: Hurricane Ridge and Elwha River

Following breakfast in the lodge, meet the group and head towards Hurricane Ridge. With stunning views along the way, the drive alone is rewarding. On clear days, you can take in magnificent panoramic views of the park – views NPCA is working hard to save from detrimental regional haze pollution. Explore on foot, learning about everything from goat removal in the park to Olympic marmots and endemic plants. After lunch in the area, we'll drive to the former Elwha Dam site. NPCA played a critical role in the removal of two dams from the Elwha River, resulting in a world-class river and salmon restoration project. NPCA experts will share the story of a challenging but victorious journey to free this river and its ecosystem. From here we will head to charming **Port Angeles**, where we will have the opportunity to relax along the waterfront, take in the views and explore shops downtown. Then, we'll gather as a group for dinner at a local restaurant before ending the night back at Lake Crescent Lodge. Lake Crescent Lodge (B, L, D)







DAY SEPTEMBER 21: Lake Crescent and Sol Duc Falls

After breakfast, enjoy your time at leisure at **Lake Crescent Lodge**. You will have the option to join a group **kayaking tour** on Lake Crescent — the perfect opportunity to learn some of the secrets of the lake: its formation, unique ecology, phantom forest, wildlife, Spruce Railroad tunnels, legends and history. After lunch at the lodge, we will venture to **Sol Duc Falls**, where we can witness 50-foot waterfalls, listen to the thundering sounds, and look for rainbows in the mist and **cutthroat** and **steelhead salmon** below. We'll spend the rest of the afternoon relaxing at Lake Crescent Lodge or hiking through towering evergreens. Wrap up the day with dinner at the Lodge. *Lake Crescent Lodge* (B, L, D)

DAY SEPTEMBER 22: Bainbridge Island

We will enjoy our last breakfast in the park before we load up and begin our 2-hour and 15-minute drive to **Bainbridge Island**. Upon arrival, we'll head to the **Bainbridge Island Japanese American Exclusion Memorial**. Built of old-growth red cedar, granite and basalt, the memorial honors the names of all 276 Japanese and Japanese Americans who were exiled from Bainbridge Island by President Franklin D. Roosevelt's Executive Order 9066 and Civilian Exclusion Order No. 1 in 1942. The **national historic monument** also cele-

brates this island community that defended its Japanese American friends and neighbors, supported them while they were away and welcomed them home. Here, we will uncover NPCA's priorities to ensure the National Park Service safeguards, preserves and shares stories of all Americans. After, we'll have lunch in **Bainbridge Island's quaint Downtown**, with free time to explore the many boutiques, galleries and wine tasting rooms. From here, we'll check in to our comfortable lodging before heading out for a final dinner as a group. We'll spend our last night together reflecting on a memorable and educational week on the Olympic Peninsula. *The Marshall Suites (B, L, D)*

DAY SEPTEMBER 23: Depart for Home
